WA seeks national ownership rules

PHARMACISTS in Western Australia want to see national harmonisation of ownership rules across all states and territories, a state-wide review of pharmacy ownership reveals.

The report found a number of WA-based pharmacists expressed concerns about interstate ownership of pharmacies, suggesting "proprietors could not meet their obligations if they did not have a physical presence in the business".

"There was some support for owners to need to be resident in WA when owning a pharmacy located in WA," the review's authors said.

"However, proprietors are already accountable and there was no specific evidence that these

Fake nurse fine

A MAN who presented himself as a registered nurse to get a job as the nursing director of a Victorian agedcare facility would have been jailed by Ringwood Magistrates' Court had new penalties applied.

The Court fined the man a total of \$60,000 and ordered to pay costs of \$4,000 to the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency, after pleading guilty to four counts of unlawfully representing himself as a registered nurse. pharmacies are less safe [than those with owners in-store]." The review also supported retaining rules allowing pharmacists to own a maximum of four pharmacies in the state, "until such time that there is agreement between states and territories on alignment of this limit between Australian jurisdictions".

The review recommended that "Western Australia actively pursue, or at least engage in, progress with other state and territories, towards harmonisation of pharmacy legislation around Australia".

"This should be progressed at a suitable Ministerial and intergovernmental level, through an appropriate forum for such agreements," the authors said. "In any discussions of this type,

PSA "transformation" underway

THE Pharmaceutical Society of Australia (PSA) is undergoing an "operational transformation" designed to strengthen the advocacy and training it provides its members.

In a statement issued to **Pharmacy Daily**, PSA National President, Dr Chris Freeman, confirmed the organisation has commenced a restructure ahead of its involvement in negotiations with the Federal Government and Pharmacy Guild of Australia over the Seventh Community Pharmacy Agreement (7CPA). "Dr Shane Jackson will remain as PSA's CEO through to at least the end of 2019, to drive the 7CPA negotiations, and guide the operational transformation that will build a stronger Society," he said.

"PSA's operational transformation is focussed on delivering value for our members across advocacy, policy, education and training within the PSA. The transformation includes significant investment in our digital offering and member experience."



Western Australia should seek to ensure that harmonisation does not lead to a material lessening of the robust regulatory system already in place in this State.

"These discussions should consider whether maximum ownership limits in each state allows a form of corporate ownership that is contrary to the intentions of individual jurisdictional law."

TGA opioid RUM push

PAIN patients with unused opioids are being urged to return them to their local pharmacy, as part of a social media campaign being rolled out by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA).

The social media push encourages consumers and health professionals to use the hashtags #RemoveTheRisk and #ReturnYourOpioids.

With close to 150 people hospitalised every day in Australia as a result of an adverse event related to opioid medications, the TGA has launched the campaign as part of a concerted effort to reduce risks (PD 04 Jul).

"Australians who are prescribed painkillers and don't use them all are advised not to keep them 'just in case' or for use down the track,"

the TGA said.

"Keeping unused prescription pain medication in the home is dangerous for children and pets if accidently consumed, and can be a target for theft and misuse.

"Unused pain relief medication, like all medicines, can be returned to a local pharmacy for safe disposal free of charge."

The TGA also highlighted its move to upschedule codeine from Pharmacist-Only to Prescription Only, has led to a "significant decrease in the number of products supplied to Australian patients".

The TGA found no increase in the supply of high-strength codeine products following upscheduling and the data also suggested patients previously on OTC codeine did not switch to other opioids.

Wanda Beach Pharmacy move & rebrand

WANDA Beach Pharmacy at Soldiers Point Road, Salamander Bay, NSW, has relocated "just a few steps" along the road adjacent to the Soldiers Point Medical Centre and rebranded under the Chemsave banner group.

The new address is now closer to two GP surgeries and retirement villages and offers a wheelchair ramp for easy access.

Pharmacy owner Yong Cao told the Port Stephens Examiner, "Moving to the new store will enable us to carry more stock and provide more services.

"The pharmacy still has the same experienced friendly staff and our long time local pharmacists Sandra and Kerry to work in the shop and recently pharmacist Sonia has joined us to work a couple of days a week which allow us to provide home medication reviews and Medschecks," he said.

The new store will also house an extended range of vitamins and health products to help with a wide spectrum of issues including muscle gain, weight loss and general health and wellbeing, Cao said.



Sunscreens OK

THE Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has reaffirmed the safety of all ARTG listed sunscreens, meaning that pharmacies can continue to promote and sell these registered products.

Referencing its own studies conducted in 2017 and those of the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) more recently, the TGA summarised by saying "Sunscreens are not likely to cause harm, but the risk of skin cancer from UV radiation is real" - tga.gov.au.

12-month script benefits

PROVIDING 12-month scripts for oral contraceptives has demonstrated financial benefit for the US Veterans Affairs department, according to new research out of Pittsburgh, USA.

Using a cohort of 24,309 women, the study showed that adopting a 12-month dispensing option for the pill produced "substantial cost savings for the payer compared with standard 3-month dispensing, while reducing unintended pregnancies among women veterans".

The work was published in JAMA Internal Medicine and can be accessed HERE.




