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#### Qatar takes CZ 5%

**QATAR** Airways has confirmed the acquisition of a 5% stake in Guangzhou-based China Southern Airlines.

QR said the purchase was part of an ongoing strategy to "invest in the strongest airlines around the world and continue enhancing operations and network connectivity".

Qatar Airways Group CEO Akbar Al Baker said the complementary strengths and resources of the carriers created opportunities to work together and build a long-term relationship "in ways that would bring benefits to customers of both airlines.

"The investment is a clear demonstration of Qatar Airways' continued commitment to connecting travellers across all corners of the world in a way that is meaningful and convenient".

Qatar Airways is a member of the oneworld alliance, while China Southern is currently unaligned, having this week formally ended its membership of the SkyTeam alliance (TD 16 Nov).

# CX pricing glitch

**CATHAY** Pacific has confirmed it will honour massive discounts on a number of First and Business class tickets which sold earlier this week for flights between North America and Vietnam.

Some of the seats are normally priced at up to \$22,000 but a glitch saw them offered for about \$970 as part of a New Year's Eve promotion.

# Michael James firmly in Bestjet frame

MICHAEL James, the disgraced former owner of Air Australia who presided over the carrier's \$97 million collapse in 2012, has been heavily implicated in the operations of the failed Bestjet Travel (TD 18 Dec), with a preliminary report to the administrators repeatedly citing his involvement with the OTA.

Yesterday the company's administrators held a meeting of creditors, with about 30 people in attendance including furious consumers and representatives of consolidators, airlines and IATA.

Bestjet's current owner, Robert McVicker, who placed the company into administration less than six weeks after acquiring the business in early Nov, provided a summary of the situation from his point of view, admitting that he had no access to Bestjet's accounting package and suggesting the administrators "contact Michael James on 0409



355 133 for payroll information".

A list of creditors also refers repeatedly to "M. James", with the incomplete schedule detailing debts of more than \$700,000 owed to Skyscanner, \$420,000 to Kayak, \$46,000 to QBE and a \$65,000 claim by David Lanning, former director of Wynyard Travel.

Other major creditors cited include IATA, CVFR and credit card processor Integrapay, but the amounts owing are "still being

calculated," according to the list. McVicker's list of assets owned by the company include a \$3.6m bank account, a credit card in the name of Michael James and software in the company's Philippines office and the "cloud" valued at about \$600,000.

Debtors listed, based on projected sales for 2018 which "may be disputed depending on contracts," include \$3.2 million claimed to be owed by Sabre for "sector rebates" as well as sales overrides from a range of carriers including Philippine Airlines, Air India, Finnair, Qatar Airways, China Airlines, Turkish Airlines, Royal Brunei, Vietnam Airlines, Oman Air and Air China.

An estimate of moneys owed by Sabre and CVFR is "based on information provided by Michael James," the report states.

In 2016 Bestjet undertook a concerted legal campaign against AFTA in an attempt to overturn a decision not to renew the company's ATAS accreditation based on the "Close Associate" provisions of the ATAS charter.

Bestjet has repeatedly denied Michael James (pictured) had any involvement in the firm set up by his wife Rachel James just weeks after the Air Australia collapse.

# New Caledonia alert

**HEALTH** authorities in New Caledonia have declared an epidemic of dengue fever across the entire country, with the majority of confirmed cases in the Noumea metropolitan area.

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade has updated its Smartraveller advice for the South Pacific nation, urging Australian travellers to protect themselves from mosquito-borne illnesses.

# Schwartz invests in Qld

PRIVATE hotel investor Dr Jerry Schwartz has made his first investment in Queensland with the \$70 million purchase of the five-star Hilton Surfers Paradise from the Chinese group, Ja Feng.

The Hilton Surfers Paradise (pictured) includes 169 rooms and 220 apartment-style residences along with four restaurants and bars, a spa, conference and function facilities, four pools, an outdoor deck area and car parking.

"I believe there is enormous potential for growing the hotel's business," said Dr Schwartz.

"I have great faith in the Gold Coast as Australia's premier family, couples and groups market because its beaches, natural attractions, theme parks, events, restaurants and nightlife provide a complete tourism package that is attractive to both the domestic



and international travellers."

Dr Schwartz added that the destination is ideally positioned to "take advantage of the boom in international travel from Asia and the Pacific".

"With Gold Coast and Brisbane international airports expanding their range of source markets, I thought it was the ideal time to enter the market," he said.

The deal is expected to settle in May 2019, with Schwartz's other properties including the Sofitel Sydney Darling Harbour, the Fairmont Resort in the Blue Mountains, Ibis Sydney King Street Wharf, Rydges World Square, Novotel Newcastle Beach and Crowne Plaza Hunter Valley.

## **HLO NZ expansion**

HELLOWORLD has announced the addition of two new member agencies in New Zealand, with HLO NZ Executive GM Simon McKearney saying the expansion adds about NZ\$100m in turnover to the group.

The additions to the Associate Networks ranks include Barlow Travel, operated by Peter Barlow, and Keith Sumner's Gilpin Travel, both of which were formerly part of the First Travel Group.

"It is great that such businesses will be joining the Helloworld NZ family in the New Year," McKearney enthused.

He said the value propositions in the varying Helloworld networks were incredibly strong "and now sit as best in market," adding that many agencies want "surety of their direction and future and hence the attraction of Helloworld".

Express Travel Group is currently in negotiations regarding a majority investment in First Travel Group NZ (**TD** 19 Dec).

# Virgin Voyages rego

VIRGIN Voyages, the fledgling cruise venture backed by human headline Sir Richard Branson, has opened up registrations for travel agents wanting to book pax on its cruises set to debut in 2020.

Travel agent partners will be referred to as "First Mates" and a special website at firstmates.com will feature online training and details of incentives, including an opportunity to have tea with Branson himself.

Bookings for the first *Scarlet Lady* voyages are scheduled to open on 14 Feb - more details in tomorrow's *Cruise Weekly*.

#### CA carrier ceases

**CALIFORNIA** Pacific Airlines, a regional carrier which launched just two months ago, has grounded its flights due to a claimed shortage of pilots.

The carrier operated non-stop from Carlsbad to San Jose, Reno, Las Vegas and Phoenix.

The suspension is only temporary, the airline said, but has not indicated when operations will resume.

INDIA'S second-largest airline Jet Airways has admitted it failed to make debt payments to select banks, leading to a 5% dip in its share price this week.

Etihad Airways holds a 24% stake in the cash-strapped Indian carrier, which is now undertaking a two-year cost cutting program seeking savings of US\$280m.
