DL ups Sydney

DELTA Air Lines will increase its frequencies between Sydney and Los Angeles to six flights per week effective from 08 Mar.

New Globus vaccine policy

THE Globus family of brands will require proof of COVID-19 vaccination or a negative test result from passengers as they depart on its tours, river cruises and independent holiday packages in Australia and abroad.

The new policy, which will become effective in Apr, will see travellers provide proof in digital or printed format of COVID-19 immunisation at least 14 days prior to travel: or proof of a negative COVID-19 test result within 72 hours of departure; or proof of recovery from a confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis within three months of travel.

"Without one of these verifications, travellers will not be able to join a planned holiday with Globus, Cosmos, Avalon Waterways or Monograms," the company said.

Globus said it would also facilitate - and cover the cost of - additional COVID-19 testing if required for guests to return to their home country, as well as tests during a trip if guests show symptoms.

"The health and safety of our travellers is our number one priority," said Gai Tyrrell, the group's MD Australasia.

"We have continued to enhance on-trip safety standards throughout the pandemic to ensure we're ready to welcome guests back to travel when the world is ready," she said.

The company has also shortened the final payment window for all brands to 45 days prior to departure, with the aim of giving customers even more confidence about booking.

This measure complements the Globus family Peace of Mind Travel Plan which gives clients the flexibility to move trips to any other 2021 or 2022 date, destination or itinerary without penalty.

Shorten urges help

FORMER ALP leader Bill Shorten has written to Federal Treasurer Josh Frydenberg urging the Government to "not leave travel agents left behind and stranded by extending JobKeeper beyond 31 Mar".

Shorten, who spoke in favour of the industry in Parliament last week (TD 05 Feb), noted that with international borders closed until late 2021 at the earliest "a considerable number of travel agencies will not start receiving cash flow until 2022," with the planned cessation of JobKeeper likely to see many small businesses close.

He also urged the clarification of "inconsistencies" in the \$128m Consumer Travel Support Program.

Crown loses a big hand

HOSPITALITY and casino operator Crown Limited is scrambling to deal with the fallout of a NSW Government report which has recommended that a gambling licence to operate within its new billion-dollar property at Sydney's Barangaroo should be denied.

Two Directors of Crown, Guy Jalland and Michael Johnston, resigned this morning, with the report from the NSW Independent Liquor and Gaming Authority finding significant corporate governance and risk management problems, which included the alleged facilitation of money laundering and fostering of a poor work culture for staff.

SIA defers spend

SINGAPORE Airlines (SIA) has deferred over S\$4 billion in capital expenditure on aircraft delivery agreements, reaching a pact with both Airbus and Boeing to revise its delivery schedules.

The new agreements will result in some of the airplanes in the SIA orderbook delivered over a longer period than the originally contracted five years.

This will enable SIA to defer capital expenditure and recalibrate the rate of capacity as necessary during the pandemic.

Israel and Greece form COVID deal

ISRAEL and Greece have agreed to terms on a travel deal that will allow citizens from both countries to travel in a green lane so long as they are vaccinated for COVID.

No specific percentages have so far been outlined in terms of how much of each country's population would need to be inoculated before a travel bubble could commence.

Speaking at a press conference overnight, Greek PM Kyriakos Mitsotakis said health certificates for travel would likely be the template for other nations who have advanced their vaccination programs to an acceptable level of safety.

"I expect what we will be doing with Israel to be a trial run for what we can do with other countries," he said.

WA to relax rules?

WESTERN Australia has hinted it may seek to relax its 28-day community spread rule to open its borders for interstate travel.

As it stands, other states must record 28 days without community coronavirus spread before travellers from the state are considered for entry to Western Australia.

WA authorities are now considering slashing that time to two or three weeks over the coming days, following advice from WA's CHO Andy Robertson.

He said states which reached 14 days without community spread usually go on to hit 28 days.

Theme park help

A NEW bill is being introduced into the California Assembly this week that aims to get major theme parks in the state to open earlier than currently prescribed, citing a need for a level playing field between small and large parks as the reason.

Large parks like Disneyland, which has a capacity of 15,000, may only reopen when the county it is located in reaches a minimal COVID threat level of yellow, despite smaller parks being able to reopen under the moderate threat level of orange.

Judge people not countries: WTTC

THE World Travel & Tourism Council (WTTC) is imploring governments around the world to focus on high-risk travellers and not high-risk countries when implementing travel restrictions.

"We cannot continue labelling entire countries as 'high-risk' which assumes everyone is infected," WTTC CEO Gloria Guevara said.

"Not only does it stigmatise an entire nation, but it also halts travel and mobility," she added.
