

Shanghai to Perth lands

THE first direct flight linking Western Australia and Shanghai touched down at Perth Airport vesterday morning.

The inaugural China Eastern flight from Shanghai Pudong Int'l Airport to Perth marked the beginning of a seasonal trial service and China Eastern Airlines' first direct flight to Perth.

It will operate thrice weekly (Mon, Wed & Fri) until 17 Feb and has been timed with the peak of the Chinese New Year season, with an average load factor of over 80% across the five weeks and a number of flights nearly at 100% capacity.

The service utilises Airbus A330 aircraft, offering 3,480 seats between Perth and Shanghai across the trial with Economy

airfares leading in at \$698 return.

Perth Airport CEO Kevin Brown said the trial non-stop service between Shanghai and Perth gave Western Australians an opportunity to experience Chinese New Year in Shanghai and would hopefully result in a vear-round service for WA.

"If the trial is successful and leads to the introduction of three weekly services year-round, it could mean an additional \$40m in tourism spend for the WA economy," Brown said.

"If we can continue to grow the number of visitors to WA, the flow-on benefits for tourism operators, hotels, hospitality and retail outlets could be enormous."

Prior to the flight, WA Tourism Minister Paul Papalia led a delegation in Shanghai, where he presented China Eastern Airlines with an offer for a regular ongoing direct service to Perth (TD 13 Jan) - more on page four.

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oneworld ups Africa in Apr

THE oneworld airline alliance will significantly increase its presence in northern Africa effective 01 Apr, with the formal addition of Moroccan flag carrier Royal Air Maroc.

The airline has been undergoing a 15-month implementation program since it became a member-elect (TD 06 Dec 2018).

Royal Air Maroc will add 39 new destinations in 23 countries to the oneworld network, with its Casablanca hub connected to over 100 destinations including oneworld hubs at Amman, Doha, London Heathrow, Madrid, Miami, Moscow and New York.

From the start of Apr oneworld frequent flyers will enjoy the full range of alliance benefits and services when flying Royal Air Maroc, while the one million-plus members of the carrier's Safar loyalty program will be able to earn and redeem awards on all oneworld members.

Oneworld Chief Executive Officer Rob Gurney said the "quality, service and global network offered by Royal Air Maroc will position oneworld as

AIRASIA'S Group President Bo Lingam has flagged plans for the carrier to establish a new lowcost airline in Cambodia.

The intention was revealed during a meeting with Cambodian leaders earlier this week, the Khmer Times reports.

the preferred alliance in Africa, where Casablanca is a leading global financial centre".

Royal Air Maroc, which already codeshares with several oneworld member carriers including American Airlines, Iberia, Qatar Airways, Royal Jordanian and S7 Airlines, is the first new full member of the alliance to be added since 2014.

The airline's regional subsidiary, Royal Air Maroc Express, will also become a oneworld affiliate, and flights operated by the carrier will be available as part of the oneworld Explorer and Global Explorer fares from 01 Apr.

Other recent oneworld developments include the announcement of an alliancebranded lounge in Moscow (TD 20 Dec 2019), as well as the launch of a "fresh brand positioning".

QR, MH codeshare

QATAR Airways has expanded its codeshare agreement with Malaysia Airlines, providing pax with access to Sibu & Alor Setar in Malaysia, as well as Medan & Surabaya in Indonesia, while MH guests will be able to book travel to 20 new QR gateways across Europe, America and Africa.

The expanded partnership becomes active from 27 Jan.

MEANWHILE OR has added eight new cities across Kazakhstan. Philippines, Turkey, Angola, Ghana, France, and Cambodia.

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Fires drive down stays

PRELIMINARY accommodation data for Dec 2019 shows the Sydney drive regional market has been significantly impacted by the ongoing bushfire crisis, according to real estate analytics company STR.

The sub-market, defined as the two-hour drive radius from Greater Sydney, showed yearon-year, double-digit declines in three key performance metrics, including a 14.7% drop in room nights sold, a 14.5% decline in occupancy rates to 52.2%, and an 18.4% slump in the average daily rate to \$194.74.

Hotels in city metropolitan areas have not suffered the same sharp decline, which STR believes is attributable to the regional location of most bushfires.

"Because the physical impact of the bushfires has been predominantly across the Great Dividing Range of New South

Wales and Victoria, we've not yet seen significant demand decreases in the major city areas of Australia," said STR Regional Manager - Pacific Matthew Burke.

"However, these regional locations are popular tourist spots for family holidays in vacation homes, hotels and holiday parks, and the post-Christmas period to the end of Jan is peak season," he added.

Hotel occupancy in South Australia is also expected to be hit hard by the fires, STR has indicated, with the destruction to property on Kangaroo Island expected to have a direct impact on tourism in the short-term.

"The focus is on the wellbeing of those dealing with incredible devastation around the country...but we also want to do our part to keep the industry informed of hotel performance developments," Burke said.



Bushfire donations

THE outpouring of support from the travel sector for victims of the bushfire crisis continues, with Qantas and its subsidiary Jetstar announcing a donation of \$1 million to the Red Cross Disaster Relief and Recovery Fund.

The airlines have also set up a special funding page to donate to the Red Cross HERE.

Meanwhile the same charity has received a \$30,000 donation from Wyndham Destinations Asia Pacific, with the resort company also revealing it will be giving free holidays to Mt Hotham - Dinner Plain CFA volunteer firefighters who have been fighting fires in the Victorian High Country.

Another hospitality group doing its bit is Outrigger Hotels and Resorts, which is preparing to host a special fundraising event on 26 Jan at the Outrigger Waikiki Beach Resort in Hawaii.

The company has also pledged \$7,270 to wildlife charity WIRES.

Plane fuel dump

DELTA Air Lines is being investigated by the US Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) after a Shanghai-bound flight dumped fuel over several schools as it was returning to LAX after experiencing "an engine issue" on Tue.

A spokesperson for the airline told a press conference 13 cleaning crews had been dispatched to the schools after the incident, and they had reopened on Wed.

China A380 Melb

CHINA Southern will increase capacity on its Melbourne-Guangzhou route between 11 Jan and 14 Feb, using an Airbus A380 on the route during the summer peak season for the first time.

The A380 will offer eight First class, 70 Business class and 428 Economy class seats on the route, which is usually serviced by A330 aircraft.

EbixCash expansion

AMADEUS has announced a strategic travel technology partnership with EbixCash to deliver more personalised experiences across travel touchpoints in the Asia Pacific and UAE.

Ebix CEO Robin Raina said the expansion of EbixCash to the Amadeus Travel Platform would "empower travel agents and travellers alike".

Contiki's vegan trip

CONTIKI has launched a new eight-day vegan-friendly food odyssey from Berlin to Budapest.

The Vegan Food European Explorer tour will include a vegan cooking class in Budapest, a dinner cruise along the Danube and interactive food tour in Berlin.

The tour departs Berlin on 16 Aug, with bookings made by 27 Feb starting from \$2,264 under Contiki's Global Sale.

Shanghai-Perth's big impact



THE first direct flight from Shanghai to Perth arrived to much fanfare yesterday morning.

China Eastern's trial thriceweekly service will operate for five weeks (see **page one**) arriving into Perth at 9.50am and departing at 11.50am until Mon 17 Feb.

The seasonal trial is a partnership between the State Govt, through Tourism WA, Perth Airport, Tourism Australia and China Eastern Airlines.

The WA Government will work with the airline to secure the route as a regular service.

Tourism Minister Paul Papalia welcomed the arrival, highlighting

the potential impact of ongoing direct flights.

"Shanghai has a population of more than 26m people, which is more than the number of people who live in Australia," he said.

"Ongoing direct flights between Shanghai and Perth would open up a massive new visitor market and the interest in the trial flights has been encouraging."

Tokyo refreshes for games



TOKYO Tourism has revealed details of numerous "revitalising" redevelopments for the capital city in the lead-up to the Olympic and Paralympic Games Tokyo 2020, taking place 25 Aug to 06 Sep.

Last year saw the refresh of Shibuya Station and its surrounds, while this year, Tokyo's waterfront, Nihonbashi, Toranomon, and Shinjuku areas and more will all undergo makeovers.

Noteworthy projects include the new Toranomon Hills Station on the Tokyo Metro Hibiya Line, which will begin operations right before the start of the Olympic Games, and Toranomon Hills Station Tower, which will be integrated with the station and reach completion in 2023.

As part of the Nihonbashi Revitalisation Plan, construction will begin this year to take the Metropolitan Expressway underground, while the now covered up Nihonbashi Bridge will "once again be a centrepiece" for the area's waterfront.

Additionally, Shinjuku is set to receive "another spectacular tower", the 48-storey Kabukicho 1-chome Project (pictured), which will house a hotel, a cinema and restaurants, and is due for completion in 2022.
